

Benefit Limit Exception (6 Script Limit)

List of Automatic Exceptions

An exception to the limit of six prescriptions will be granted automatically at the point-of-sale when the benefit limit has been exceeded and a claim is submitted for a drug included in one of the classes listed below.

- Antianginal medications
- Antiarrhythmic medications
- Anticoagulant/Antiplatelet medications (cilostazol excluded)
- Anticonvulsant medications
- Antidepressant medications (duloxetine excluded)
- Antiemetics
- Antihypertensive medications
 - Includes doxazosin, prazosin, and terazosin
- Antiinfective medications
 - Includes HIV/AIDS and Hepatitis medications
- Antiparkinsons medications
- Antipsychotic medications
- Asthma and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD) medications (leukotrienes and omalizumab excluded)
- Cancer medications
 - Cancer chemotherapy
 - Hematology
 - Immunosuppressives
- Chronic kidney disease medications
- Diabetes medications (oral and insulin)
- Enzyme deficiency agents
- Family planning agents
- Glaucoma medications
- Gout medications
- Hemophilia agents
